Blend Tool

The Blend Tool in CorelDRAW is used to create a series of intermediate objects and colors between two or more objects. This tool is helpful for creating smooth transitions, gradients, and dynamic visual effects.

Key Features:

- Blending Shapes: Gradually transform one shape into another.
- Color Blending: Transition smoothly between colors of objects.
- Path Blending: Blend objects along a specified path for creative effects.

- **Contour Steps**: Allows customization of the number and spacing of contour lines.

Steps to Use:

- 4. Adjust the number of steps, offset, and contour color in the property bar.

Shadow Tool

- Glow and Feather Options: Soften shadow edges for realistic effects.
