Accessing the Gradient Tool

- 1. Open CoreIDRAW and select an object (e.g., rectangle, circle, text).
- 2. Navigate to the Fill Tool on the Toolbox (shortcut key: G).
- 3. Choose Fountain Fill from the options or directly select the Interactive Fill Tool.

Gradient Types
