

How to Make Glowing Effect in Video with Photoshop & Premiere

Step 1: Export Frame from Premiere Pro

1. **Open Premiere Pro** and locate the frame you want to add the glowing effect to.
2. Position the playhead at the exact frame you wish to export.
3. **Export the frame:**
 - Click the **Camera Icon** in the Program Monitor or go to **File > Export > Frame**.
 - Choose the file format (e.g., JPEG, PNG) and the destination to save the frame.
 - Click **OK** to export.

Step 2: Edit Frame in Photoshop

1. **Open Photoshop.**
2. **Import the exported frame:**
 - Go to **File > Open**, then select the exported frame from Premiere.
3. **Add Outer Glow Effect:**
 - Select the layer that needs the glow.
 - Right-click on the layer and choose **Blending Options**.
 - In the **Layer Style** window, check **Outer Glow**.

 - Go to **File > Save As** and save the file in a format like PNG or JPEG.

Step 3: Import the Edited Frame Back into Premiere

1. **Go back to Premiere Pro.**
2. **Import the edited frame:**
 - Go to **File > Import** and select the edited image from Photoshop.
3. **Replace the Frame:**
 - Locate the original frame in the timeline and replace it with the newly edited frame.
 - If necessary, adjust the duration of the frame to match the timing you want in the video.

Step 4: Animate the Glowing Effect (Optional)

1. To make the glow effect dynamic, you can use keyframes in Premiere Pro to animate the opacity or scale of the glowing layer.

2. For example, you could gradually increase or decrease the size or opacity of the glow over time to make the effect more dynamic.

Final Step: Render and Export Video

- Once you are happy with the glowing effect, render and export your video from Premiere Pro.
