

# Creating a Rolling Text Animation

## Step 1: Create Your Text Layer

1. **Open Premiere Pro** and create a new project or open an existing one.
2. **Go to the "Graphics" Panel:** Click on **Window > Essential Graphics** to open the panel.
3. **Create a New Text Layer:**
  - Click on the "Type Tool" (T) in the toolbar.
  - Click anywhere on the Program Monitor and type your text.
  - Customize the text (font, size, color, etc.) using the **Essential Graphics** panel.

## Step 2: Set Up the Rolling Effect

1. **Position the Text off-Screen:** Move the text so it starts off-screen at the bottom (for rolling text going upwards).
  - In the **Effect Controls** panel, go to **Motion > Position**.
  - Adjust the **Y Position** to place the text below the visible screen.

## Step 3: Create Keyframes for the Animation

1. **Set the Starting Position:**
  - Move the playhead to the starting point of the animation (where the text will begin).
  - In the **Effect Controls** panel, click the **Stopwatch** next to **Position** to create a keyframe.
  - Adjust the Y Position to move the text just below the bottom of the screen.
2. **Set the Ending Position:**
  - Move the playhead to the end point of the animation (where the text will finish).
  - Adjust the Y Position to move the text to just above the screen (so it ends off-screen at the top).
  - Premiere will automatically create a second keyframe at this point.
3. **Smooth the Animation (Optional):**
  - Select the keyframes in the **Effect Controls** panel.
  - Right-click and choose **Ease In** for the ending keyframe or **Ease Out** for the starting keyframe, to smooth the animation transition.

## Step 4: Use Masking for Text Visibility (Optional)

1. **Create a Mask:**
  - Select the text layer in the **Timeline**.
  - In the **Effect Controls** panel, click on the **Pen Tool** under the Opacity section.

- Draw a mask around the area where you want the text to be visible. This ensures that the text only shows up within a specific area.
- 2. **Animate the Mask (Optional):**
  - If you want the mask to follow the text, click the stopwatch next to **Mask Path** in the **Effect Controls**.
  - Move the playhead and adjust the mask's position frame by frame as the text moves.

## Step 5: Refine the Animation

1. **Adjust the Timing:**
  - Use the **Timeline** to adjust the duration of your text animation.
  - Drag the keyframes to change the speed of the text rolling up the screen.
2. **Preview the Animation:**
  - Hit the **Play** button in the Program Monitor to see how the text rolls.
  - Make any necessary adjustments to the timing or keyframe positions.

## Step 6: Export the Final Animation

1. Once you are satisfied with the rolling text animation, export the project.
  2. **Go to File > Export > Media** and choose your desired settings.
  3. Click **Export** to save the video with the rolling text effect.
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## Key Points to Remember:

- **Keyframes** control the start and end of the animation.
- **Masks** are used to control the visibility of the text within a specific area.
- You can use **Ease In** and **Ease Out** for smoother animations.
- Adjust the **Duration** of keyframes to control the speed of the animation
